Across the Movius Line

Cultural Geography of South and Southeast Asia in the Late Pleistocene

The “Movius Line” traditionally refers to contrasting aspects of cultural evolution between eastern and western Eurasia during the Lower and Middle Pleistocene, and effectively forms a boundary within Southeast Asia. The aim of this workshop is to emphasize a range of comparable contrast in the Upper Pleistocene, when modern humans arrived in this region. Changing patterns in cultural geography at this time highlight the extent to which modern humans resembled, or differed, from earlier hominin populations in terms of their adaptive strategies to different ecological zones.

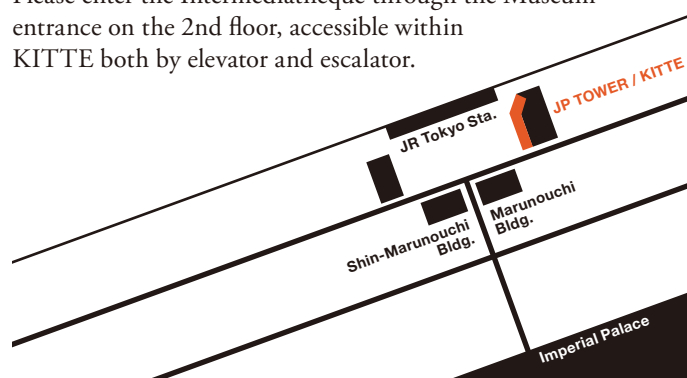
